They can be seen below on the Fantail (Rear or Stern of the ships main deck) in the shade of their canopy.






Russ, NEOG is taking his crack at steering the ship being careful not to run into any Ice Bergs as another concerned crew member watches and waits his turn. They don't look too concerned as the out door temps were pushing 90 degrees. In addition, there was not much concern with his navigational skills of the 184 1/2 foot ship as it moved 1,037 mph into the Eastern direction toward Council Bluffs. After waiting for what seemed like forever, we realized we were not going to make it because the ship was not in the water. The 1,037 mph was the rotation of the Earth.



Upon walking up the gangplank of the USS Hazard, you were greeted by Kevin KAOVNY.

He is pictured in front of one of the floats that were towed to cut loose mines so they can surface and be detonated by the Minesweeper.



A question came up on just how does a Minesweeper find and destroy mines anchored under water. The first thing is not to hit a mine. Mechanical sweeps are devices designed to cut the anchoring cables of moored mines, and preferably attach a tag to help the subsequent localization and neutralization. They are towed behind the minesweeper, and use a towed body to maintain the sweep at the desired depth and position.



In addition to the USS Hazard, I have to not forget to mention her little friend the USS Marlin, a 131 foot training sub. Maybe not the training you might think..... This sub was the Fox in a Fox hunt. The Marlin performed mainly target duty for both surface and air antisubmarine units at the Fleet Sonar School in Key West, Florida.
