APRS is Automatic Packet Reporting System in that this technology, using GPS, can be a Position Reporting System. This is what was used during the Market to Market Relay last September to keep track of the location of the bicycle as it moved along just behind the last runner. .Furthermore, it was demonstrated how a person with an APRS radio can be located with extreme accuracy. During my commute to and from work, my spouse can see where I'm at, especially during my drives to Wisconsin or Northern Minnesota, as well as those trips to Florida using the Web Page https://aprs.fi/ Of course you must acquire an APRS Radio which can cost almost as much as an HF rig. However, Mary had a couple of units (used on the bikes) with the less expensive Baofeng radios.
