DECEMBER BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

Someone said to me the other day, "How come we never hear about what goes on at the Board meetings?" Well now, I thought about that for awhile, and I said to myself, "Yeah, it would be a good idea to have someone write up a summary every month and get it in Ham Hum. I wonder who we can get to do that?" Eventually in my wisdom it dawned on me that the Club Secretary is the only logical choice, as he keeps the minutes of the meetings. OK guys, I'll give it a shot, and I promise to try and get in a few lines every month.

The December Board meeting was held on the 14th at the Red Cross Chapter House, In the absence of WBØBCB, the meeting was conducted by Treasurer and President-elect Bob Conley, WBØLYU, The following Board members were present: WBØLYU, WBØDXA, KØKES, WAØ-GEH, WBØCMC, WBØMSN, and KOPOR. In addition, the following newly elected Board members, who will take office on January 1, 1977. were present: WBØQGV, WBØJPN, and WBØGQT. The first order of business was the election of a Treasurer and Secretary for 1977, Jim Wilson, WBØJPN, was unanimously elected as Treasurer. This is something that all repeater users should start thinking about now, not a few weeks before it needs to be done. If anyone has anv specific comments suggestions, they should contact either a member of the repeater committee or one of the Board members before the next Board meeting, which is scheduled for January 18th.
