



# 1981 ANNUAL MEETING AK-SAR-BEN AMATEUR RADIO CLUB, INC.

In last month's issue you were informed that the Annual Meeting of the Corporation will be held at the Douglas/Sarpy County Chapter, American Red Cross, December 11, 1981 at 7:30 p.m. It is really the Heartland Chapter, but don't let that confuse you. The name has been changed. It's the same as Douglas/Sarpy County Chapter, only it now includes Cass County as well.

For those of you who didn't read the article last month, or perhaps did not even open the publication, we repeat the nominees selected by the

Nominating Committee.

The Club Articles of Incorporation provide for the election of a President, Vice President and four members of the Executive Council each year. The President is elected for a one-year term, with an additional term as Immediate Past President, two years total. The Vice President is elected for a one-year term. Four members are elected each year to the Executive Council with a two-year term; thus, we elect 6 members and have 5 remaining on the board. The nominees selected by the Nominating Committee are presented at the Annual Meeting. Additional nominations will be requested from the floor and may be made by any member at that time.

The procedure will be a follows:

First the nominations and voting for a President.

When the ballots are counted and the President is elected, we proceed to

Second, the nominations and voting for a Vice President.

When the ballots are counted and Vice President is elected, we proceed to

Third, the nominations and voting for no more than four members of the Executive Council. When the ballots are counted and the 4 members of the Executive Council are elected, the election is over.

Should any present member of the remaining Executive Council be elected to the office of President or Vice President, it will create a vacancy on the Board. The new Board, as their first order of business of the new year, select a member to fill the vacancy and present that selection to the next meeting of the members for approval.

The President, the Vice President, the Immediate Past President and the eight members of the Executive Council make up the Board of Trustees. This new Board elects from its own members the Secretary and

the Treasurer to serve as such for one year.


computer.
