Amateur Television

John Gebuhr, WB0CMC, gave a talk on the basics of ATV. He said that it doesn't take much to set up a station: a \$15 camera, a monitor, a 440 MHz transceiver, an NTSC tuner/VCR that can tune to cable channels 57 through 60, and a 70 cm beam antenna. For setting up a repeater, consider adding a 200W analog linear. (However, a 20 watt transmitter has been



used in the past on his system.) A 2 meter transceiver that can be used for simplex talk-around on 146.52 would also be handy.

If you wish to experiment with receiving ATV, you can try a cable-ready tuner set to channel 57, a monitor, and the beam antenna. Note that is cable channel 57 (421.25 MHz), not broadcast channel 57 (720.25 MHz). Point your antenna to Benson High School where John has his repeater. For details, see the web page at:


August Raffle Prizes

Radio Wave Propagation

A number of observatories around the world measure solar activity. A weighted average of this data is used to determine the International Sunspot Number (INS) each day. Solar cycles (Sun Spot cycles) have an average duration of about 11 years. Solar maximum and solar minimum refer respectively to periods of maximum and minimum sunspot counts. Cycles span from one minimum to the next. Sunspots are temporary phenomena on the Sun's photosphere that appear as spots darker than the surrounding areas. They are regions of reduced surface temperature caused by concentrations of magnetic field flux that inhibit convection. They usually appear in pairs of opposite magnetic polarity. Their number varies according to the approximately 11-year solar cycle. Samuel Schwabe, a German astronomer, was known for his studies and observations on sunspots. The thing to remember for test questions is the sunspot cycle is typically 11 years. The fact that Schwabe was looking for the planet Vulcan inside the orbit of Mercury might be a myth. One should ask Mary about that.
