D-STAR Communications

For the September meeting, Wade Watts KEORNT gave a talk on D-STAR (Digital Smart Technologies for Amateur Radio). He described its various operating modes, such as point-to-point, repeater, interfacing to the Internet, and reflectors, among others. He stated that a properly configured D-STAR transceiver permits communicating with other D-STAR users in the city, across the country, and in other parts of the world.



Wade discussed how to get started with D-STAR and register your first rig. The process is free and need only be done once. The data is decentralized and can be automatically applied to any new rig you buy. He also described crossband operation, modules, and repeater control.

Wade stated that there are apps available to interface an Android to D-STAR for text and picture communications. The interface can be through Bluetooth or USB, though USB isn't as reliable on Samsung devices. He pointed out that pictures and text can be useful when working at a disaster.

Wade also provided a handout that gave some essential information on D-STAR and listed some local hams who will help you get registered. On the list are Corby KOSKW, Bryan KOBNM, Wade KEORNT, Brian NIOP, and Kyle ADOZC.

Repeater Timers

Most repeaters have a timer in the controller that starts counting down when you begin to transmit. This clock starts from about three minutes., or shorter. If you transmit continuously through the repeater past its timer length, the repeater will go off the air. This is called "timing out". Repeater timers usually reset when you stop transmitting. If the repeater has a courtesy "beep", the timer may reset at that time. So to avoed being dumped by the repeater timer, you have to keep your transmissions under the timer length and slways wait for the "beep". A lot of times you may hear someone talking on a net and they occasionally say, "let me let the repeater drop",; that is what they doing to allow the repeater to reset that timer. You also may hear instructions from a Net Controller telling operators to call Net Control, then let the repeater "drop" (that's when you hear that beep) then give your call sign. This is the general protocol during the ARES Info Net on Sunday nights. Bottom Line, keep you conversations short or so not to time out the repeater(s) you use.

While we were assisting the 2017 Corporate Cup Run, a gentleman approached Dave NOJSB and asked if we would consider helping out on a 10K run called "Beat the Heat" on July 8^{th} , 2018. He supplied his phone number, and was contacted by us to get some more details.

The route is along the Wabash Trace Nature Trail, and the 10K portion starts at the point where the trail intersects 240th street, southeast of Council Bluffs, and the runners progress down the trail to the trailhead, not far from Iowa School for the Deaf. The odd thing about this event is that it is two races in one, on the same course. The 10K runners start at the southeast end of the course. And the 5K runners start at the trailhead end, and then turn around at the 2.5K mark and come back to the finish line, which is where the 10K runners will also finish.

They only use one timing device at the finish line, so they need to start both ends of the race at the exact same time. They have tried using cell phones in the past, but the coverage is difficult on the trail at the far SE end. They needed us to give them the ability to start the runners simultaneously. We weren't sure about repeater coverage, but after some testing, we were confident that we could pull it off. That's really all that they wanted from us, but we also posted volunteers along the route to be there if we were needed.

Everything turned out good, and they were very pleased with the results. Both sets of runners started at 7AM right on time, and we were done by 10AM. Our thanks to these volunteers that came out early on a Sunday morning.
