Treasurer's Report - Dave, NOJSB – As of September 30 the club accounts had balances of: Main Checking \$2,125.86, Repeater Checking \$362.97 Savings \$6,996.36, CD Life Member one \$6,548.26, CD Life Member two \$6,802.00, and CD Repeater \$1,114.25 This leaves the balance of all the club accounts at \$23,949.70. In the month of September there was no income. In the month of September there were expenses of \$466.41 consisting of \$200.00 for Club Liability Insurance, \$17.00 for Trailer Plates, \$100.00 for Donation to the Red Cross, and \$149.41 for Picnic Food.

President's Report - Pat, WOOJU – The president was not present, and his report was read by the Secretary:

a. Nominating committee met on Tuesday October 5. As immediate past president is unavailable due to medical reason, Mitch our former president agrees to chair this year's nominating committee

i. A slate of officers has been nominated and the plans are to have elections process this year following the bylaws.

ii. Need to propose modifying the bylaws in case of a future pandemic or other disaster. Would like Brian Z to assist in crafting.

- Presented to AARC membership and the consensus was that it was a great idea, and we would equally share in the revenues and cost with the exception of the raffle.

ii. BARC did the vast majority of the planning and implementation. We should be very thankful.

iii. Pat Connell paid personally for a table to sell and deliver our club clothing, patches, and decals for the event.

WØPHW —- Silent Key

John Willard Orr, 30 OCT 1923 - 31 Aug 2021

A veteran of World War II and an American Patriot, John was born in Tarkio, Missouri to Willard and Lucille (Ely) Orr. During High School, at the age of 17 he earned his Ham Radio License. His call letters were WØPHW. He graduated from



Omaha Technical High School in 1941 and soon after went to work for Western Electric installing telephone central office equipment. John was proud to serve his country. During World War II, John volunteered for the Army Air Corp and was assigned to the First Army's Airwaves Communication System. He spent most of his overseas time on Sterling Island in the South Pacific as a radio technician and in charge of the squadron radio equipment. John returned home after the war to his job at Western Electric, later accepting a position at Northwestern Bell where he would work for the next 40 years. This past June they celebrated 63 years of marriage to his wife Evelyn. They shared a love for exploring the history and beauty of our country which they passed on to their daughters and grandchildren. Camping, hiking, fourwheeling, road trips and history lessons filled our family vacations. John created and designed a custom kitchen with an icebox for the back of the family sedan. Tent camping led to travel trailers and finally, motor homes. With their daughters grown and retirement at hand, John and Evelyn traveled throughout the United States. For many years John and Evelyn would travel to Arizona for the winter months where they explored the backroads with their Jeep.

John was a past President of Ak-Sar-Ben Radio Club in 1952.
