## AARC Field Day 2022

Most valuable players from Boys Town staff were Jay Powers, Bob Solonyka, and Michael Archibald AKA Archie. Boys Town provided a



powerful RF super quiet generator on a trailer. The generator was big enough to generate enough power for two buildings and the fieldhouse!! They provide a 120 amp panel with approximately 60 outlets. We had approximately 25 AARC members drop by and a number of operators plus about 25 plus visitors. Several youth, staff, and alumni from Boys Town stopped by and we had the opportunity to brief them on Field Day and the role amateur radio can play in providing emergency communication, besides being a lot of fun and educational. I think there may be some new hams and some new AARC members come out of this Field Day.

As mentioned in the minutes, the program during the June AARC meeting was presented by Michelle Leenerts, AuD and Susan Von Derfecht, AuD. These two are Doctors of Audiology from the Boys Town National Research Hospital in Omaha,NE.

The AuD program is designed to produce audiologists who are skilled in providing diagnostic, rehabilitative, and other services associated with hearing, balance, tinnitus management, and related <u>audiological</u> fields. These individuals help patients with hearing problems primarily by diagnosing hearing loss and fitting hearing assistive devices. Many factors effect our hearing; not only excessive noise from aircraft, guns, power tools,, factories, excessively loud radios in vehicles that rattle windows as they past by, but also Ham Radio Operators. We often listen (with or without headphones) from static noise to make out stations we try to make contact with through the air ways. Michelle and Susan described

the changes in technologies that have occurred over the years. Boys Town is internationally recognized as a leader in clinical and research programs focusing on childhood deafness, developmental language disorder, and related communication disorders. In 2013, we began a new frontier in neurobehavioral research using brain imaging techniques to better help diagnose and treat troubled children with severe behavioral and mental health problems.
