They are planning on a bigger field day in 2023 at Boys Town. Boys Town is promising a larger location (the former Welcome Center) with air conditioning and the large generator. #### WINTER FIELD DAY

For the 5<sup>th</sup> year, the Western Division SATERN team activated for Winter Field Day from the garage of the Salvation Army's Emergency Disaster Services building operating as a 3I station, meaning they team was able to operate 3 radios and they were operating indoors. Other classifications for the event include "home" stations and "outdoor" stations.

SATERN participates in events like this to improve their operating skills, experiment with ways of expanding communications capabilities from the station at the Salvation Army location, as well as understanding the stations, capabilities and maintaining station readiness. This year all three stations were run using only battery power, showing that communications can be maintained for extended periods of time without commercial power.

This year, SATERN also hosted an open house inviting many newly licensed hams as well as other Salvation Army volunteers, staff and officers to learn more about SATERN and how to get involved. Several

The exact number of attendees isn't known but more than 20 visitors signed in during the 3 hours of the open house. During that time frame many folks, both SATERN members and visitors, got on the air and made contacts from the two active stations operating on 20 and 40 meters being managed by Pat KØCTU and Kevin KAØVNY respectively. The third station was on hold as the Western Division SATERN Coordinator, NØTRK explained the operation and SATERN to the numerous visitors. But later several contacts on 144MHz and 440MHz.

## Progress is as follow:

Field Day will be held at Boys Town in the old credit union cottage. If you are driving west on Dodge Street, it is next to the 40 foot brick tower labeled with the Boys Town Name.

There are several rooms, plenty of emergency service with A/C and other facilities.

Part of the street will be closed down to give us plenty of room for towers, antennas, and other wires.

This year we will be operating 2A with the following stations.

A Digital/CW station with an ICOM 7300.

A SSB station with an ICOM 7600.

A GOTA station with an ICOM 7300.

A VHF Station with an another 6meter/2 meter radio

Antennas will include the club's 3 element tribander, 5 element 6 meter beam, Dipoles at 50 feet, and multiple verticals.

Each stations will have computerized logging

We will be inviting select High School STEM students to learn about amateur radio and hopefully be guest operators.

Rigs will have programed messages to assist operators.
