In a demonstration to members of Congress, May 24, 1844, Samuel Morse sent the first message over a telegraph line stretching 40 miles between Baltimore, MD and Washington DC. It consisted of just four words suggested to him by Annie Ellsworth, the daughter of the commissioner of patents: "WHAT HATH GOD WROUGHT"

Before electric telegraphy, most messages that traveled long distances were entrust-

ed to messengers who memorized them or carried them in writing. These messages could be delivered no faster than the fastest horse.

Morse had been commissioned to paint a portrait of Lafayette in Washington DC in the year 1825;

while there, a horse messenger delivered a letter from his father with news that his

wife was recovering from an infectious illness. However, the next day he received a letter from his father stating that his wife had died. Morse left Washington for his home at New Haven, CT leaving the portrait of Lafayette unfinished. By the time he arrived, his wife had already been buried. So upset that he was not even aware of his wife's illness and her passing, he made it his quest to explore a means of rapid long distance communication.

In 1832, Samuel Morse was returning to the U.S. from Europe aboard a packet ship Sully, he was at the dinner table conversing with a gentleman, Dr. Charles Thomas Jackson of Boston, an American physician and scientist who was active in medicine, chemistry, mineralogy, and geology. Dr. Jackson was also well schooled in electromagnetism. Morse, witnessing various experiments with Jackson's electromagnet, developed the concept of a single-wire telegraph. Morse set aside his painting career and submitted his patent ap-

plication of the original Morse Telegraph. In time the Morse code, which he developed, would become the primary language of telegraphy in the world.

Morse encountered the problem of getting a telegraphic signal to carry over more than a few hundred yards of wire. Enter Professor Gale, who taught chemistry at New York University. Together they solved the distance problem by adding extra circuits called relays at frequent intervals allowing messages to be sent at a distance of up to ten miles. Soon, they were joined by a man with skills, insights, and more

importantly money, Alfred Vail. However, more funding was needed. Morse travel to Washington D.C. In 1838 seeking federal funding for a telegraph line but was not successful. It was not until he gained financial backing by Maine congressman Francis Smith. On his final trip to Washington in 1842, he set up wires between two committee rooms at the U.S. Capital, and sent messages back and forth to demonstrate his telegraph system. Congress appropriated \$30,000.00 in 1843 for construction of an experimental 38 mile telegraph line between Washington D.C. , and Baltimore along the B&O Railroad.

On May 24, 1844, the line was officially opened and Morse sent the now-famous words "What hath God wrought.
