Parks on the Air – Ashfall Fossil Beds State Historic Park Activation

Parks on the Air is an ongoing activity that took hold after the ARRL's wildly popular National Parks on the Air. That event took place in 2016 as part of the Centennial Celebration of America's National Park System. Ak-Sar-Ben Amateur Radio Club's KØ-USA call sign was one of the few club call signs to be on the air regularly for that event. Since then, KØUSA has continued to be on the air from the great outdoors from time to time.

This activation happened after Kyle ADØZC had made a trip to Ashfall Fossil Beds State Park as a visitor, and seeing the expansive unobstructed view at the park, immediately thought about Parks on the Air and laid the ground work with the park superintendent, Rick Otto, giving him an overview of the Parks on the Air and what where the operations could be setup.

Kyle then reached out to the KØUSA regular activators, Pat KØCTU and Mary NØTRK to see if they were interested. Of course they were! So, on August 8th, the trio struck out early in the morning for the three hour drive to Royal, Nebraska to "activate" Ashfall State History Park for Parks on the Air.

The park is now open by reservation only, but the group was expected and were allowed access to the site before it opened for visitors for the day.

The site also has a large picnic area that borders a section of grass land that is left in its wild state providing a perfect location to set up a couple of radio stations and a place to keep the antennas and feedlines out of the way. ADØZC brought his setup and started out on 6 meters with a home brew 6 meter dipole, but soon moved to his 20 meter ham stick dipole. After a bit of troubleshooting to solve his high SWR, he was in business. 40 Meters was productive for a while, but soon died. KØCTU decided to set up for a couple of satellite passes and was successful on the second pass. But soon the group was back to it on HF and switched the antenna to a 20M ham stick on the AD tripod.

Band conditions were not the best, but all-in-all the group made 59 unique contacts, which more than met the 10 required for a park activation to be considered successful. It was also Kyle's first time setting up a station for a Parks on the Air activation. He learned a few tricks so his next trip should be more successful for him.

The stats for KØUSA are now a total of 26 activations at 10 different parks, and have over 4500 contacts from those various parks. (Parks on the Air, also counts our National Parks on the Air activities)

Field Day 2020 was a Field Day like no other. Social Distancing requirements driven by the COVID-19 virus meant that many clubs and groups could not have the large Field Days that they normally hosted.

But like so many situations, ham radio finds a way to stay on the air. The ARRL made some quick temporary changes to the rules to allow more stations to participate as individuals or small groups, and

change the way that club scores get calculated. This last change allowed many groups to maintain social distancing as required, and still maintain their streak of participating in Field Day. Ak-Sar-Ben ARC has participated in every Field Day since 1946 (at least)

According to the ARRL Web site the AARC had 12 individual entries. 8 operating from their home using commercial power (1D), 2 operating from home using emergency power (1E or 2E), 1 went mobile (1C) 1 was a one person portable (1B1) - all of stations will have their scores added into the score for the Ak-Sar-Ben Amateur Radio Club. Those results are usually revealed by the ARRL in November.

Of those twelve, nine also correctly submitted logs to the club site for a bit of local competition. As one of those was the under KØUSA callsign there are eight who will be eligible for awards. And all eight are eligible for a random drawing for a \$50 HyVee Gift Card. The drawing will take place during the AARC September club meeting, so be sure to attend (via zoom, I am sure). The awards are still being determined and will also be announced during the AARC September meeting.

Thanks to our reluctant Field Day Captain Adam KDØMMG for once again organizing a successful Field Day. And for field day minion Mary NØTRK – for keeping Adam on track.



Amateur Radio Direction Finding (ARDF) - is an exciting branch of amateur radio activities, attracting people from youngsters and teenagers to experienced old timers and veterans. Participants of these events arrive at the spot announced by the organizer, with the RDF gear and running shoes. Their task is to take radio bearings to find four or five hidden low power transmitters in the area. The winner of the event is the amateur who discovers, visits all transmitters and gets to the finish line in the shortest possible time.
