IN 1998 the ARRL and the National Weather Service created an event to say "Thank You" to all of the amateur radio operators across the country who donate their time and expertise during and after significant weather events.



On December 3 2016, The National Weather

Service in Valley will be participating for the 19th time and wants to extend an invitation to all area amateurs to come visit the office and get on the air during one of the most popular amateur radio Special Events.

Most of the activity will take place on Saturday and will be on HF, VHF/UHF (including repeater and APRS traffic) so, mark your calendars and come out to the NWS office 6707 North 288th Street, Valley, NE.

The following info was provided by **Bill, KEOXQ** regarding using the radio for selling equipment over the air. There was a situation that arose on a local Swap Net where the NCS advised those on the net that computers were not allowed to be advertised on such net. Not so. As long as computers are used in conjunction with the operation of your amateur station there is no problem. Normally, amateurs are prohibited from benefiting monetarily from amateur communications, but there are several narrow exceptions. Amateur operators may notify other amateur operators of the availability for sale or trade of apparatus normally used in an amateur station, provided that such activity is not conducted on a regular basis [97.113(a)]. A regular basis" means "not every day." The FCC staff has also said that mentioning the price over the air is okay, but the "haggling" should be handled on the telephone.
