

Slow Scan TV Presentation by Mark NOVUB



The October AARC Presentation was on Slow Scan TV. Mark, a Ham Radio Operator for over 22 years, explained about transmitting pictures on a narrow voice channel. A bit of history, the SSTV concept was introduced by Copthorne Macdonald in 1957-58. Used by NASA in the

60's to transmit some pictures during the Apollo 11 mission. Mark displayed some images on one of the software applications used and answered questions for those who used SSTV in the past. For those that are interested in SSTV, see the picture below that lists a number of URLs on this topic.


Rollie, AB0NN said, "Door prizes, we got em.". All tickets are retained until the December meeting for the big drawing.


