2006 ARDF Championship



Adam KDØMMG presents ARDF

For January, Adam KDØMMG presented a video on the USA Amateur Radio Championship held in 2006. This contest is a form of fox hunting that combines radio direction finding and another skill called "orienteering." Most hams are familiar with fox hunting—using portable radios and antennas to locate by triangulation a hidden transmitter. In many cases, this is done by hiding the transmitter in some area of the city, then hams (either singly or in teams) drive about and attempt to locate it.

ARDF contests take things one step further by hiding multiple transmitters in a wooded area and imposing a time factor. The orienteering part involves the contestants using a map and a compass to help keep track of where they're at and where they may be in relation to the transmitter(s). Also, due to the wide area involved and the time limits, some running may be involved in order to complete the course on time.

The sport had been popular in Europe for a number of years and, at the time of the video, was beginning to catch on in the United States. The location of the 2006 contest was in Raleigh, NC, and involved competitors from across the US and parts of Europe.

The event took place within the 5300 acres of Umstead Park and covered a three-day period beginning Friday, April 7, and ending on Sunday. The first day involved a practice run to get people familiar with the area and the procedures. On Saturday, contestants searched for 2 meter transmitters, while Sunday it was 80m. In general, it was reported that 80 meters was somewhat easier as moving the antennas gave a better null; also, the 2 meter band was subject to a lot of reflections.

Emergencies happen, and most of them not when we expect them. I think that may be why the are "Emergencies." Anyway, enough for now, please contact me if you have any questions or needs.


