

### ANTENNA MODELING WITH EZNEC



Fred Eriksen, KBØLF

For the November meeting, Fred Eriksen, KBØLF, demonstrated the fundamentals of designing amateur radio antenna systems using the EZNEC modeling software. Specifically, he focused on EZNEC version 5, which will work on all current 32- and 64-bit versions of Windows except Windows 95 and NT.

He started by explaining that the EZNEC program was written by Roy Lewallen, W7EL, and is available for \$89 for the basic version, and \$139 for the extended version,

EZNEC+. Lewallen also sells professional versions in the \$500-\$650 price range. Fred mentioned that there is also a demo version of EZNEC that is free, but has only a limited number of things you can do with it. For his presentation, Fred used the EZNEC+ software.

Fred explained that the EZNEC program was a graphical user interface for a modified version of the public domain NEC-2 program—which does most of the number crunching. The user enters the parameters for the antenna and related information into the appropriate fields on EZNEC, which in turn converts it into data that the NEC (Numerical Electromagnetics Code) program can understand. NEC then crunches the numbers and returns the results to EZNEC, which displays them to the user. The results can consist of numbers, text, and pictures—such as 2D and 3D images of radiation patterns.

Fred described the basic functionality of the software, what kind of data were needed in the various fields, and what the buttons did. He showed how to set up the software for a 40 meter 1/2 wave dipole and display the resulting radiation pattern. He then showed how he used EZNEC in a real-world setting where he strung a long-wire Beverage antenna using 1000 feet of copper wire from a tower to a nearby field. He showed how to factor in parameters like ground conductivity and dielectric constant, their effect on the pattern, and how to tune it for better performance.

In summary, it was an interesting and information-packed evening—more information than can be covered here. Fred stated that he'd be willing to help anybody if they had questions about using the program (email address below). A lively Q&A session followed his talk:

Bill True first licensed as WN9ASD some time ago. He progressed through his Novice year with a home-brew transmitter and a couple of different used receivers. After a painful several months he successfully upgraded to a Conditional Class license with the call of WA9ASD. Successful upgrading consisted of finding the ham in town who had the worst (slowest) impression of what 13 wpm sounded like. This lead to a couple of years of confounding the 'Donald Duck' guys by zero beating his transmitter with their signals. Everything was fine until they discovered the other sideband and the evil carrier in their receivers. "EEEWWWW, AM!" His first interference complaint came from the next door neighbor who said she could hear him on her telephone. The complaint was that she couldn't hear the other side of the conversation. His foray into 2 meters experienced no interference complaints although some local hams said they could hear his super-regenerative receiver.
