RadioSTAT AM Transmitter

For most of us, amplitude modulation was probably one of the first radio technologies we'd learned. After CW, it is the simplest of ways to send information on an RF carrier. The modulating signal controls the amplitude of the carrier and two sidebands result. From there, things get more complex: there's SSB, FM, PSK, spread spectrum,

In August, we went back to basics with a presentation on an AM transmitter by Whitney Shipley, KDØIFS. Whitney is the Assistant Director of the Douglas County Emergency

Management Agency, and the transmitter is a RadioSTAT Portable Emergency Advisory Radio Station manufactured by Information Station Specialists (http://www.theradiosource.com/).

The presentation took place in three phases: Members who arrived early helped set up the transmitter and antenna outside the west entrance of the Red Cross building. We then went inside and, after taking care of Club business. Whitney gave her excellent and informative talk (more below). For the final phase, we went back outside to watch the system in action, discuss its features, and generally enjoy the nice weather.

Whitney described how the EMA had recognized the need to get vital information to the public during an emergency. It had to be something that didn't require specialized equipment, something that most everybody had access to, wasn't dependent on a fixed power source, and was portable.

After Whitney's presentation, AARC members examined the RadioSTAT transmitter and antenna system.

The 24-foot vertical antenna, when folded, occupies only a 1x1x6-foot area, but can be quickly set up. (The literature states ten minutes, but that's probably after some practice. It took slightly longer for AARC members to set it up outside the Red Cross building.)

The system was first field tested at the College World Series earlier this summer. The CWS was chosen as it's been designated as a potential target for terrorists. In such an event, the station can be used to provide evacuation directions to people in their cars. Road signs would be placed in the transmitting area (three-mile radius) instructing drivers to tune their radios to the correct frequency—in this case 1670 MHz.

Whitney stated that the system is still new and they're still working out the processes for which it will be used. This includes budget (limited) for buying additional hardware, licensing, and coordinating with other emergency-related groups.

You have seen these control heads before if you ever watched the TV show CHiPs about 2 California Highway Patrol motorcycle troopers. The curious thing about this is that there is a shot in the opening credits that clearly show a Motorola speaker with the word Motrac on it. It must have been a car type speaker.

Note that the proceeds for each month's tickets go for buying next month's prizes. Also, all tickets are kept and included in the Grand Prize drawing in December. The more tickets you buy, the better your chances of winning at the end of the year.
