Paranormal Analysis



David Pares KCØIZT and Matt Judah

The topic for the October meeting was about using electronics to monitor and analyze paranormal activity. Specifically a portable monitoring station designed by David Pares KCØIZT (Adjunct Professor at UNO) and his associate, Matt Judah. Consisting of both off-the-shelf and custom hardware and software. the station can be packed into a medium-sized hand held case for easy transportation.

Some of the equipment they talked about included a radiation meter, a trifield meter (monitors electric and magnetic fields, plus RF),

gamma ray detector, IR and video cameras, temperature detectors, and a custom USB interface to permit sending the data to a laptop computer. Other custom items consisted of an ionization machine designed by Professor Pares and fractal analysis software by Matt Judah.

The ionization machine pumps ions into the air and is used in conjunction with some of the above equipment to detect the possibility of paranormal sounds and other activity. For sounds, the researchers use software such as Audacity to process and extract any speech that may be present.

For images, to maintain an unbiased approach, they use Matt's fractal software to analyze photographs (both past and present) in order to quickly spot touched up pictures. This ensures, for example, that a ghost or UFO wasn't added after the fact.

After describing the equipment, Dave went into detail about their research and some of their experiences—including ghosts, UFOs, and the possibility of space warp drives, among others. It is an aluminum box with a + and - 15 volt dc power supply module mounted in the back. There is an on/off toggle switch on the end of the box. Along one side of the box are 3 rows of 18-position barrier terminal strips. One of the rows is marked "in", the one in the middle is marked "gnd", and the other row is marked "out."

Inside the box is a perfboard with 17 LM301 dual op-amps, each with its own gain control. It appears that the box is some level-setting, matching, or buffer circuit for 17 low-level signal lines. (The eighteenth terminal in each row is unused.)

Nobody knew what it was, but guesses included "retroencabulator" and "multistage photon accelerator driver for a klystron modulator packed in liquid boron."

Note that the proceeds for each month's tickets go for buying next month's prizes. Also, all tickets are kept and included in the Grand Prize drawing in December. The more tickets you buy, the better your chances of winning at the end of the year.
