## 146.94 Repeater Update

Over the past few weeks, the 146.94 KOUSA Repeater has had a few issues. The repeater committee has been busy keeping up with the necessary repairs. First we noted a significant power drop, and found that the power amplifier module had failed, that was replaced when the new one came in. Most recently the audio output dropped off to almost zero. When we went out to trouble shoot that the first time, all the cards were reseated and that fixed the problem temporarily. It soon failed again, so on Saturday June 7<sup>th</sup> we returned to the repeater site and found that the deviation pot in the control module had developed a dead spot. It was repaired by adding a resistor to put the pot in a new adjustment location. At the same time the remote receive units were tuned and matched so they should be finding their way into the field soon.

## **Nebraska QSO Party**

For the Nebraska QSO Party April 26-27, three Omaha hams activated Keya Paha County, Nebraska. Former Ak ARC board member Gerry Gross WA6POZ, Jim Kilby KG0RD, and Ak treasurer Brian Zdan KM0Y operated NE0RC, the club station of the Nebraska Amateur Radio Club. ("Nebraska" is Ak-Sar-Ben spelled backwards.)

The QTH was a cottage overlooking the Niobrara River valley, near the county's southern border. Since no active hams live there, county hunters consider Keya Paha County to be "rare." Rancher Gale Larrington, who rented out the cottage to the NEORC crew, moved his tractor exactly where the hams wanted it. The raised front loader attachment made a perfect end support for the operation's G5RV antenna. A tree near the cottage supported the other leg of the G5RV.

Using an Icom 718 transceiver on the cottage's kitchen table, the group operated 20M CW and sideband during the daylight hours. After dark, the team switched to 40M until that band died. Conditions throughout the contest period were poor to fair. Nevertheless, the operation's contest log shows contacts with a majority of states and three Canadian provinces. NEORC racked up a tentative score of 10,432 points.

After the contest ended on Sunday, the three drove east into Boyd County on the way back to Omaha. There, just a few miles from where the Missouri River meets the state's northern border, lies the community of Gross, Nebraska Gerry 'POZ finally got to visit the town with the same name as his. The official Department of Roads highway map lists the population of Gross as five. According to the sign at the edge of town, however, that figure is off by forth per cent.



# 2008 MS Bike Ride, Saturday and Sunday (July 12 and 13)

Once again the Bellevue Amateur Radio Club will be sponsoring the communications support for the 2008 Multiple Sclerosis Two Day Bike Ride.

This is a great chance for new hams to get involved in public service events. You need not be a member of any club, ARES, or RACES to volunteer your time and resources. No experience is required. If you are new to Amateur Radio public service events, we will give you hands on training in a practical and fun environment. This event gives us "old-timers" the chance to continue the tradition of helping others. So mark your calendars now, and spread the word around to your fellow hams and club members.

The MS Two Day Bike Ride will be Saturday and Sunday (July 12 & 13). This is the weekend before the Cornhusker State Games in Lincoln. Plans are to have the Two-Day bike riders start in Omaha Saturday morning and end in Lincoln Saturday afternoon. Locations of the traditional Saturday evening celebration party and awards dinner are still pending. The exact routes have not been determined at this time. The MS Society provides an official MS Society Bike Ride t-shirt, and meals both days to the volunteers.

Required resources will include a dual-band mobile radio and suitable antenna. Hand held dual band radios may also prove useful depending upon your assignment, and proximity to the repeaters. If you do not have dual-band radios, 2 meter radios will work. We will be using 2 meter frequencies as much as possible for primary communications, and 70cm frequencies for backup. Stations with APRS capability are encouraged to bring along their equipment and use it.

If you have a GMRS/FRS radio, you may want to consider bringing it with you. The riders will be encouraged to use channel 1 (without any PL tones) should they need help.

Amateur Radio operators are needed to staff water stops, SAG vehicles, bike repair vehicles, medical support vehicles, and last rider vehicles on the route. Specific duties for each will be provided at a later date.

## **Babcook Memorial bicycle race**

Over the past few years we've been helping the Babcook Memorial bicycle races. The date for this year is Saturday, July 12, and Sunday, July 13th. This year the format will be a little different.

The races will consist of a time trial and two criteriums, but no road race. A time trial is a race against the clock where each rider is started on the course in one or two minute intervals. A criterium is a race held on closed city streets and lasts for a specific time or number of laps. The Saturday time trial will start at 8:00 AM and should run until 10:30 AM or so. The route starts at Mount Michael and heads north on 216th up to Bennington road and back to Mt. Michael. The Saturday criterium will be held in Papillion, and will start at 2:00 PM and will run throughout the day, and will end at 9:00 PM. The Sunday criterium will be the same downtown Omaha route that it has been for the past few years, and it will start around 9:00 AM and will run throughout the day. As soon as I know the exact location of the routes, the maps will be posted on our AksarbenTalk web page in the files section.
