I'm sure most of us are pretty familiar with reading HF propagation forcasts, but with the numbers so bad I thought this reprint from KQ6XA might be of interest:

Todd KK0DX

KQ6XA RULE OF THUMB for How To Read HF Propagation Numbers.

The A index = LOW is GOOD. 1 to 6 is BEST 7 to 9 is OK 11 or more is BAD

SFI index: HIGH is GOOD. 70 NOT GOOD 80 GOOD 90 BETTER 100+ BEST

K index: LOW is GOOD.
0 or 1 is BEST
2 is OK
3 or more is BAD
5 is VERY VERY BAD

A low "A index" is most important! For Low Power Portable DX openings at 10MHz to 30MHz, look for an A index LESS THAN 6.

Helpful Hints from Joe WØLHZ

Do you know how to type the Ø symbol with your computer keyboard--- WØLHZ instead of W0LHZ? Type W (hold ALT KEY DOWN-----with NUN LOCK indicator on ---using number keys at lower right hand side of keyboard press 0216) then L H Z. The number Keys above QWERTY keys will not work. This is one feature of the built in Character Map Generator in most Windows computers and is available in the many different fonts and sizes.

The Character Map Program extend the capabilities of the keyboard. An introduction to the Character MAP can be found at http://www.frontpagewizard.com/use_alt_keys.asp: This is limited information and you might want to explore all other possibilities on your own. If you are using Windows 98 it is located at Programs>>Accessories>> Character Map. To find in XP requires a Search for the Character MAP program CHARMAP.EXE. When you type in CHARMAP make sure you select "More Advanced Options" as it will come up empty handed with a regular search. A list of items will come up in the Search Window and you are looking for an ICON followed by charmap.exe. Placing a Short Cut on your Desktop is recommended and then open from the Short Cut.

Using your cursor I would recommend creating a short cut on your Desktop. It is unbelievable what characters are available that can be selected. The Icon you are looking for is charmap.exe.
