OFFICIAL BULLETIN NR 973 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CONN OCT 5 1964 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

FCC has issued a notice of proposed rulemaking which would limit the eligibility for the Conditional Class license to applicants residing more than 175 miles from an FCC district office or a quarterly or semianeral examining point. Present Conditional Consess would not be affected, nor would eligibility of handicapped overseas personnel. The date for filing comments on this proposal is November 16. RISING RADIO INTERFERENCE CAUSE OF CONCERN TO COM-MERCIAL RADIO.

A recent article in the newspaper called attention to interference problems to users of commercial equipment. Culprits cited radio were radio-controlled garage door openers, electric razors, doctors' diathermy machines, many vacuum cleaners and high-powered industrial wood gluing machines to name a few. Of particular concern is interference to emergency vehicle communications. The problem is so severe nationally that a conference of 500 scientists is being held in Chicago on November 17 through 19 to discuss the problem. The Illinois Institute of Technology Research will conduct the conference for the Army, Navy and Air Force. It is expected that better design of electronic equipment, better shielding and grounding of electrical devices will result. This problem has been known to the amateurs for years but our voice has not penetrated the commercial interests to any great degree. Let's hope that suggested cures and necessary legislation will be swift and accurate.
