During the last membership meeting, Brian, WEOBEP asked if anyone would like to step up and be interviewed for a sort of member biography or special interest article interview for Ham Hum publication. Yes, a great idea so lets start with you (Brian) so here is the first article on WEOBEP below



My name is Brian Pitchanau, call sign WE0BEP. My interests in Communications goes back to the 1960's in Vestal New

York where I grew up. A friend of mind used to run wire through the trees and tried to use Morse code to send messages to each other. After graduating from High School in 1969 the war in south

east Asia was a concern to me and I was not keen to having serving in the Army, because I also grew up with a more affordable hobby; flying model airplanes. So I was determined to enlist in the US Air Force. Learning code must have been what caused me to do well enough on a test I took in basic training



and I was sent to Florida to train as a Morse Intercept. This is where I improved my

code skills as well as typing. Picture to the right is (not me) a radio operator at one of the AN/FLR –9 antenna sites. It is a very large circular Wulleneber antenna array, built at locations worldwide during the cold war for HF/DF direction finding of high priority targets. The worldwide network, known collectively as "Iron Horse", could locate communications almost anywhere on the planet. Because of the exceptionally large size of its outer reflecting screen (1056 vertical steel wires supported by 96 120-foot towers), the FLR-9 was commonly referred to by the nickname "Elephant Cage." as you can imagine looking at the pictures below.







Unfortunately for me, I was never given the opportunity to work in this field because the Air Force trained too many radio operators. Over 400 students upon graduation of "diddi bop" training as it was called, where then given the opportunity to further train in any career field of our choice or enter the administration field at any base of our choice. I was thinking of Air Traffic Control but due to the long waiting list decid-

ed to just become a Radar O'Reilly

So I was stationed in Boston, MA for a year but then again re-trained into the Procurement Field (later named Contracting) I spent over 44 years in contracting and spent billions of taxpayers dollars on all sorts of types of contracts. During my one and only





assignments overseas was at Clark Air Base, in the Republic of The Philippines in 1979—1982. The days of President Ferdinand Marcos (but that's another story). This was the first time I got to see up front and personal to one of the Elephant cages I would have worked in. I used to scare the Filipinos by telling them that those were high powered Electro Magnets that would be turned on in the event the Soviet Union launched a missile at the US. The magnet would pull the missile off course and crash it in the Philippines. I think some of them believed me.

Well, since the end of the Cold War and the changes in technology and development of Cyber Space, Satellites, and such; the Elephant Cages succumbed to the wrecking ball. But not the one in the Philippines. Mt. Pinatubo took care of that one in 1991. So powerful was the eruption that it sent an ash cloud as far as Europe, and reduced the global temp by 0.5 degrees. Clark AB was destroyed and closed down. The Philippine Government took over and the old elephant cage was turned into a 35,000 seat fabric-covered amphitheater. You can still see the Hugh white pillars that surrounded the outer parameter of the antenna. Upon stationed at Offutt AFB, I decided to become involved in Ham Radio and joined AK-SAR-BEN-ARC in 2012.
