## Board Meeting Minutes for July 2003

### Minutes of the Board of Trustees Meeting AkSarBen Amateur Radio Club – July 2003

The AkSarBen ARC Board of Trustees met on July 1, 2003 at the Red Cross Building in Omaha. President KAØKCV called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. Present were: Jim Westcott, KAØKCV, President; Bob Boetcher, NEØCQ, Secretary & Board Member; Dick Newsome, WØHXL Past President; Board Members: Dave Rice, NØJSB; Kurt Kettelson, KCØHMI; Bill McCollum, KEØXQ; Steve Schmitz, NØUP; and Geri Norris, N5RIG. Others attending were Barb Westcott, KCØHLB; Linda Newman, WØNSA; Bill Newman, KØNSA; Julianna Leighton, NØWAV; Dan Buchholz; Steve Wisnieski; Anthony Nunn, AJØZ and Bill Jackson, K9RZ.

President's Report: Field day was a success and everyone had a great time even the lama.

Vice President's Report: N/A Treasurer's Report: N/A Secretary's Report: The board minutes for June were presented to the board (soon to be printed in the *Hum*). There were no additions or corrections to the minutes, Dick, WØHXL made a motion to accept as presented, Bill, KEØXQ seconded, voice approval.

Dick has requested the new tapes. He was also promised 20 repeater directories and they haven't been sent. Classes are on Tues. nights from 7-10. The VE session is the last Tues. of the month at 6:30 p.m., testing fees are \$12. Dick also presented \$200 for the books to Dick, KAØKCV, to be given to the treasurer.

Field Day: Field Day was a success this year everyone had a good time. The cook shack did another great job this year and was under budget (\$467.76) there was also \$127.29 in donations and Julie is returning \$159.53 to the club. On a sad note, Julie is retiring as the head cook. Thanks Julie for all the hard work! There are two tubs of cook shack supplies (including a skillet and grill-donated by Julie) that need to be given to the new head cook.

Public Relations: Barb, KCØHLB announced the Younkers fundraiser will be November 22. The club received proclamations from the state and city for amateur radio week and a thank you from the Governor.

over the Internet and a notice in the July issue will notify the membership that this will be the last issue mailed, unless you notify a Board Member, an Executive Officer, or mail in the form printed in the July Hum for this purpose.

Repeater Committee: Steve, NØUP reported the repeater went down twice in recent weeks, lightning hit the tower and a chip went bad in the repeater at 156 & Maple, the chip was replaced with a used unit and a new replacement has been acquired and will be swapped out as soon as possible. Everything is ready for the downtown repeater; it just needs to be installed.

Technical: N/A Additional Committee Reports: None Old Club Business: Dick, WØHXL will contact Ron Clark (NØPOM) at Sarpy County that the Clegg 220 will be donated to Sarpy County ARES and any repairs necessary will be the responsibility of Sarpy County ARES. Steve, NØUP would like to have a committee set up to develop a procedural manual for the club officers and board members. An electronic copy of the current President's manual is being located, which may be the base for said new manuals. Volunteers for the procedural committee are being sought.

New Club Business: Steve, NØUP The club has a case the ICOM HF rig but the rig won't fit the current foam. New foam is expensive (\$120-\$130). The board has decided to use existing foam and re-cut it. Generator Report—Bill, K9RZ was asked to rewire the trailer lights to a more standard configuration, Bill did the rewiring and it works great. The trailer has two 40-gallon tanks and about 60 gallons were used for about 30-35 hours of use. Bill also fixed the doors; hardware was necessary to do the fix. The total for the field day gas, hardware for the doors and rewiring is \$125.38. Due to the age of the current generator, the club may want to devise a plan to replace the current generator with several smaller units. Linda, WØNSA has noticed several problems with accepting dues and new membership info. The current procedure needs to be revised. The treasurer takes the money, the membership chair keeps the membership list, and the secretary collects the money from the PO Box. This procedure could be streamlined and made more efficient. It has also been suggested that the bylaws be changed to allow the board to accept new members into the club, rather than having membership vote during the general membership meeting. It has also been suggested that an executive secretary position be created. This person could remain from year-to-year bringing continuity to the change in leadership. A new member pack is being developed, which could be given to each new member outlining the club functions, activities and events throughout the year.


