During the November program, Mary, NOTRK provided a recap of Salvation Army Team Emergency Radio Network, SATERN which is a network of volunteer amateur radio operators that provide emergency communications on health and welfare information between the Salvation Army and the general public. SATERN, founded in 1988 by Major Patrick McPherson and served as Director for more than 23 years. SATERN, now an international organization with over 4000 members in North America alone, has been providing emergency communications following disasters such as 1988 Hurricane Gilbert in Jamaica, 1990 F5 Tornado in Plainfield IL, 2001 attacks on September 11th; operators were on duty in New York, Washington DC, and Pennsylvania. And in 2005 as SATERN volunteers were in full force for 20days after Hurricane Katrina slammed into Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama. And just this past year 2017 Hurricane Maria in the US Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

Mary-NOTRK also provided a slide show on the annual Salvation Exercise at Volk Field Air National Guard Base near Camp Douglas, Wisconsin earlier this year and showed how SATERN deploys to a disaster location to provide Canteen operations for the mass of volunteers involved.

In addition, Mary provided an invitation for Club members to view The Salvation Army in Omaha and see the EDS Radio Room setup and the new Canteen Truck that would be deployed to a disaster area providing meals, snacks and drinks to rescue workers and survivors.
