On Line . . .

Last month we discovered how to use the mailbox. It really hasn't been used much so far but I suppose that is due to the fact that we hams have so many other means of communication available to us that a bulletin board has limited uses for passing messages. But, no matter! I'm sure it will be handy for leaving change of address messages and items of information so that club records can be updated on a timely basis.

WHAT NOW?

Text files are the topic of this month's mutterings. The system (I will refer to the bulletin board itself as the "system" from here on) uses text files to send you the System Bulletins, the Main Menu and the Message Base Menu, and the various news files that you can select for reading.

The text files used by the system are created by a word processor. Only the normal printable characters you normally use when writing someone a letter are used. These include upper and lower-case A-Z, numbers 0-9, and punctuation symbols. There are also special keys on computer keyboards called CONTROL keys. A special key labeled CTRL or CONTROL is pressed at the same time a normal key is pressed and the result is a special character, normally a graphics character. In word processors, these control characters are used to tell the printer to print in the underline mode or in italics or some other special printer function. For bulletin board text files, these characters are a no-no!

Different computers have different ways of interpreting and using these control characters. Let's say that a control character appeared in a system text file and you wanted to see that file. You sit down with your slick little COLLOSUS-XT and select the file for reading. When the control character is sent to you, WHAM!, your computer locks up, your screen blanks out and you start "blessing" the guy who runs that #\$%*&!! board for ruining your hardware.

Of course, this is an extreme case and your hardware won't be damaged in any event, but the point is that only normally printable characters (Not CONTROL characters) should be used in the system text files.

BUT WHY?

"Yeah, so what?" I can hear you mutter. Well, YOU can actually add information to the system in the form of text files.

A while ago we conducted a user's poll on what Amateur Radio magazines each user subscribed to. From this list, I asked several users to prepare text files with interesting information from these magazines and upload them to the board so that all who use the system could read them or download them.

This is why there is all the hoopla about text files. If you prepare an information file with your WORD-Pro Turbo Enhanced

Accelerated SuperSpeller Turbo (did I say Turbo?) AutoActuated word processor so that it prints diagonally on your printer and looks real neat framed and hanging above the TV set, no one on the board will be getting too much out of it because there are control characters imbedded in it to tell the printer how to do all those fancy things.

SO HOW?

Well, there should be a way of generating a simple text file without all of those control characters. For word processors like MultiMate (R), there is a utility called CONVERT that will remove all of those control characters and produce another file that is simple text. In other word processors like AtariWriter (R), all you have to do is avoid typing any control characters to begin with. The word processor itself will not insert any automatically so what you have when you save your file is what you need for uploading.

Whatever method you might choose to use, there are two important rules to follow when creating a text file:

- Don't use control characters!
- Remember that although you may have a 40 column screen, some guys have 40 columns so if you are creating a table or a list, it may look good to you but that guy with 40 columns is going to see a mess so use carriage returns when you think best.

Be sure to document your upload with a Comment To The SYSOP before you log off.

I should be back from vacation now and the system should be back in operation. I hope no one forgot about it! Next month, we will cover where the system is going from here and what the future holds in store for digital communications so until then, see you OnLine!
