At least three feet of ½ inch Schedule 40 white PVC pipe

Two ½ inch PVC "Tees"

Two ½ inch PVC "crosses"

6 stainless steel screw adjustable hose clamps, large enough to fit over the outlets on the tees.

I will bring the pre-cut tape measure pieces that will be used for the elements.
