I got up KETV's tower on 2 June and looked at the antenna. S nuts on the mount had never been tightened. Structurally, not a problem but could cause noise. 4 of the 4-40 screws holding the main connector were loose, one about ready to fall out. Probably the main source of the noise.

All 4 got tightened. Shaking the antenna caused a rattle inside and some noise on signals. Probably not the main source but indicates the need for a new antenna. Two of the radials have broken off (see pic) and should be replaced since they also decouple conducted noise from the mount and tower. As dry as it was today there was remarkably little noise till we started shaking things. Over all a rather successful day.

While we were up the tower, Joe Francis, our ground crew, backed up a bit to get a better view of us up on the tower and promptly got stuck. Shawn had his own vehicle and pulled him back up on the road after we got down.
