Special AARC Board Meeting

December 5, 2012

Bill WA9ASD, Secretary AARC

Introduction

At last month's club meeting, Peter Daliere, KE7RDM presented a report on the progress of restoring Freedom Park following the flooding and his project to restore the radio room to its original state. In that presentation several items were noted as missing; 806 and 860 tubes for the HF transmitter, roller inductors for that transmitter, and the VHF transmitter-receiver, a TBS-6 unit.

As a result of his presentation, an 803 tube was donated by a local radio station thanks to the efforts of AARC member Greg KGØS.

Peter also reported that he had recently located an original TBS-6, new in the original packing for sale for \$2,500 from an individual in Pennsylvania. They had negotiated a reduced price and he was raising funds to purchase it. He was also in talks with a local transportation company about getting the unit shipped to Omaha.

On December 2nd, Peter was informed that the people restoring the USS Alabama had heard about the TBS-6 and made a better offer than the price it has been offered to the Hazard (no price was mentioned). The seller agreed to honor the negotiated price of \$2000 for the Hazard provided the sale could be completed in 2 weeks.

Upon hearing of these developments there was a flurry of e-mails among board members about the Club possibly contributing to the purchase of the TBS-6. Mary, upon getting mostly positive responses to this idea, called a special board meeting for December 5th at 6:30 PM at Panera Bread at 78th and Dodge. What follows are the minutes from that meeting.

Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 6:44 PM and the following people were present. Mary, NØTRK; Dave, NØJSB; Marv, AEØEG; Bill WA9ASD; Adam, KDØMMG; John, WBØCMC and Pat KØCTU.

Mary reiterated the sequence of events of the last two weeks regarding the donations to the Hazard and the progress on the negotiations for the purchase of the TBS-6.

She also reported that through conversations with our contact in the Parks Department that the City of Omaha would handle the purchase, provided the funds were available from donations. Although the reconstruction of Freedom Park was on hold due to unrelated legal issues, the city was definitely going to move ahead with recovery efforts as soon as possible.

There was a brief discussion of the Club's account balances and near-term cash requirements. The only project coming up was the grounding of the Red Cross tower and that was thought to not require a significant amount of spending. It was also noted that there had been over \$1,000 realized from the sale of donated equipment and that there were still some fairly expensive items remaining to be sold.

At this point John, WBØCMC made a motion, seconded by Bill, WA9ASD to supply \$1500 for the purchase of the TBS-6 transmitter/receiver for the USS Hazard and to recover as much of that as possible from donations and the sale of excess Club equipment. Discussion followed. When put to a vote the motion was unanimously approved.

There was then a motion at 7:15 PM by John, WBØCMC, seconded by Adam, KDØMMG to adjourn, which was followed by another unanimous vote.

Peter was contacted by e-mail following the meeting. He expressed his gratitude for the Club's contribution to the project.

The speaker for the November meeting was Peter Dalier, KE7RDM, who gave a presentation on the plans for restoring the USS Hazard at Freedom Park in Omaha. This includes repairing external flood damage in general, and making the radio room operational in particular. As the Project Manager assigned to that task, Peter's goal is to make the radio room fully operational with actual equipment that it would have used in World War II.

Peter began the talk with a brief history of the Hazard—how it was commissioned as a combination mine sweeper/patrol craft/escort vessel after Pearl Harbor on December 7th. It was moved to Omaha in the 70s and, after

Freedom Park was acquired by the City of Omaha in 2004, it was decided to restore the ship to its peak years of 1946.

The project received a setback due to the Missouri River flood in 2011. Peter showed slides depicting the park before, during, and after the flood. The park grounds, buildings, and some of the exhibits were damaged. For the most part, the Hazard came through okay, but it had shifted position and its outer hull needed cleaning and repainting.

He stated that restoration was to be a multiple-step project: Catalog and clean the current inventory (almost done), clean and repaint the deck and walls, start restoring the equipment (including the antenna system), then test the equipment on site. Finally, announce the Grand Opening once everything is ready. The goal is to have this all done and on they air in 2013—though the exact timeline depends on when the City of Omaha can restore power to the area.

The biggest problems are to get working models of the original equipment. The TBS-710 transmitter/receiver is missing, along with working 860 and 803 transmitter tubes. (Note: Part of this problem has been solved with the help of AARC. See *Special AARC Board Meeting* on page 5.)

The project depends on donations and volunteer work; they have no budget from the city, so Peter would like to see AARC members get involved. He'd made a notebook available for getting the names and addresses of people who wished to volunteer or wanted more information. Though AARC has committed to providing some funding, the project still needs the technical expertise of Club members to get the equipment operational.
