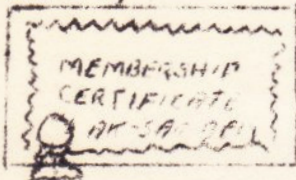

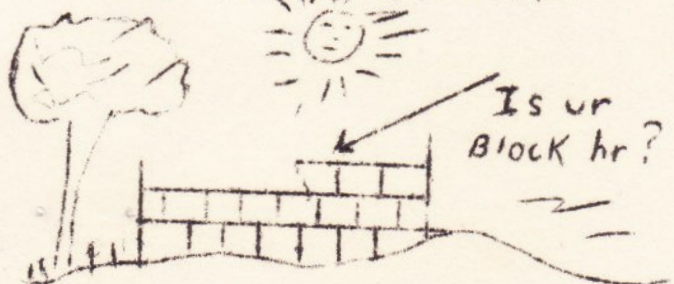

PLEASE NOTE THIS OFFICIAL BULLETIN NR 289 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS WEST HARTFORD CONN APRIL 18 1951 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS BT

ARRL has learned FCC will issue warning notices during the next thirty days to US amateurs heard working any of the countries listed in its public notice of December 21, 1950. After thirty days citations will be issued to violators. Text of the FCC public notice prohibiting communications with these countries was published on page 23 of February QST. Prefixes of the countries concerned are PK, FI, EP, EQ, IR, PJ, HS, J and OE, except JA and OE allied occupation forces station AR

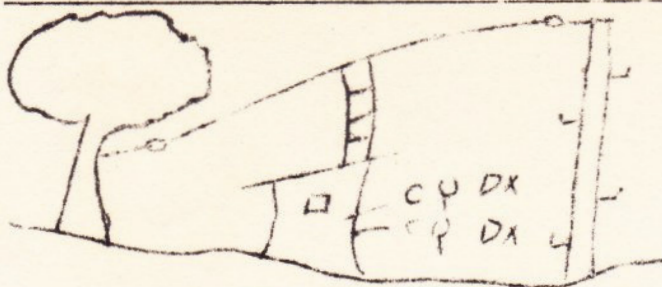


SWAN SONG

QXR has designed and HZE is building a carrier current transmitter to be installed at Omaha U.

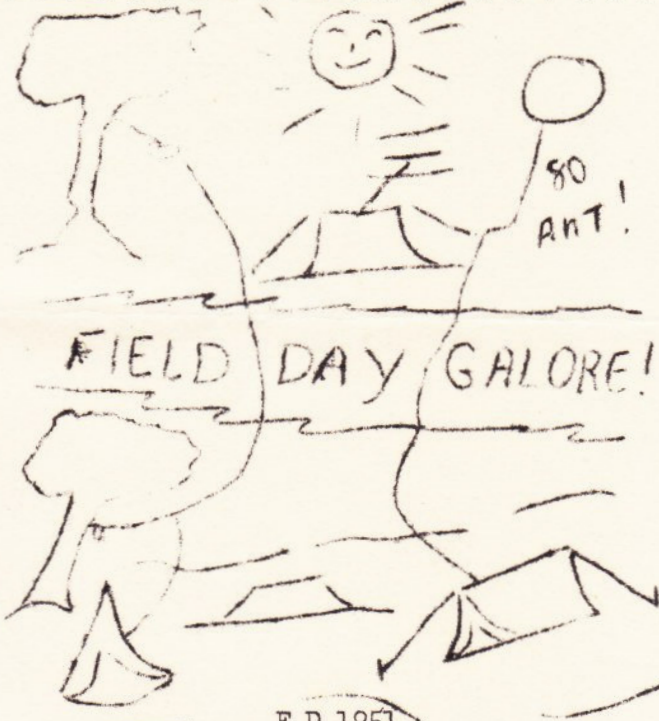
