## MOBILE NOTES

Resistor spark plugs can reduce your ignition noise very effectively. They must be used with a condenser from the switch side of the distributor to ground.

DO NOT use any other resistor or suppressor in the ignition circuit with these plugs. The plugs will also improve the idling of the motor and the plug points can be set wider. The plugs may knock off 5 mph from your top speed. But what ham drives that fast anyway except to and from work.

We visited this month's station again as we have several times previous, with out an invitation and felt welcomed. And running true to form at least one other ham was present. Usually in an evening one can depend on meeting several other hams and really enjoy himself at the Becker's.

WØBBX Doc, WØCSN Mig, WNØEGN Sonny and WNØEGF Lenere complete the operators. Soon we expect to add Kathy and Rickey to the operator list.

Doc, originally 6AID, from Sacramento started out in ham radio 22 years ago on 40 cw. In 1940 he came to Omaha attending college and as 9GHJ operated 40 cw from a suit case. Returning to Calif. and again to Omaha we find Doc WØBEX. Mig received her call in February 1950. The children their's last summer.

With more gagets per watt than most stations Doc can boast of a voice operated KW. There are also several smaller rigs one of which Mig uses to good advantage. Sonny built his own transmitter for 75 cw and is on the air.

Antenna's are many. Atop a high pole is a 5 element 6 meter beam just above a ten twenty beam. The rotation indicator is a small globe which revolves on the operating table. A double skirted 20 meter coax and a vertical folded dipole fill the roof top.

Doc, as we know him, does much construction and is very active with his mobile rigs. Three mic's in the car at once is not uncommon.

We could just scratch the surface of a very interesting station and family in a volume and knowing that most everyone in the club knows Doc and Mig will say no more.
