V.H.F.....by WØNRT

With the New Year we are welcoming the arrival of the news and happenings of the VHF stations which Millard, NRT, has promised to keep flowing to us for each issue.

At this writing the dope is with regard to the 50 and 144 Mc. operations only, although we understand that and assume that there is activity or plans for experiments and communications on 220 Mc and above. Not having any info on that phase of the VHF spectrum, we will be glad to hear from any of you that are active on those frequencies.

More than 25 stations are now active in the Omaha-Council Bluffs area on 50 Mc. with new stations making their appearance weekly. Here is a list of stations that you hear regularly on 6 meters in this area:

KØCHK, KØCBC, KØCKS-/m, KØDXS-/m, KØGYG, KØDRZ-/m, WØNRT-/m, WØUKQ, WØYZV-/m, WØRMB, WØVLI, KØCYP, WØWWN, WØVGL, WØFKG, WØFRN, WØWZF, KØCTF, WØWMF-/m, KØDFQ, WØBTG-Lincoln, KØBWV-Nebr. City.

In the Columbus, Schuyler, and Linwood area, WØPUM, AYS, VZJ, and KØEMT plus undoubtedly several more operating on 50,100 Mc. Six meters is proving to be a good communications vehicle for mobiles, operating on 50 Mc. have worked into Omaha from Plattsmouth and the Douglas County Hospital Annex with solid copy on both ends.

We have just learned that two of the 6 meter men are

currently working on product detectors and balanced modulators, ie. suppressed carrier-double side band rigs so you will be hearing more from them on this subject in the near future.

Fire up that 6 meter rig, for you can hear the crowd any night on the CD frequency - 50.466. You might also listen on 50.5, 50.6, or 50.7 which are the proposed mobile frequencies for this area.

TWO METERS*

The 2 meter band is busy most any night. Rigs run from 5763's in the final to several hundred watts. WØFKG keeps nitely contacts with WØBFB in Mitchellville, Ia., near Des Moines.

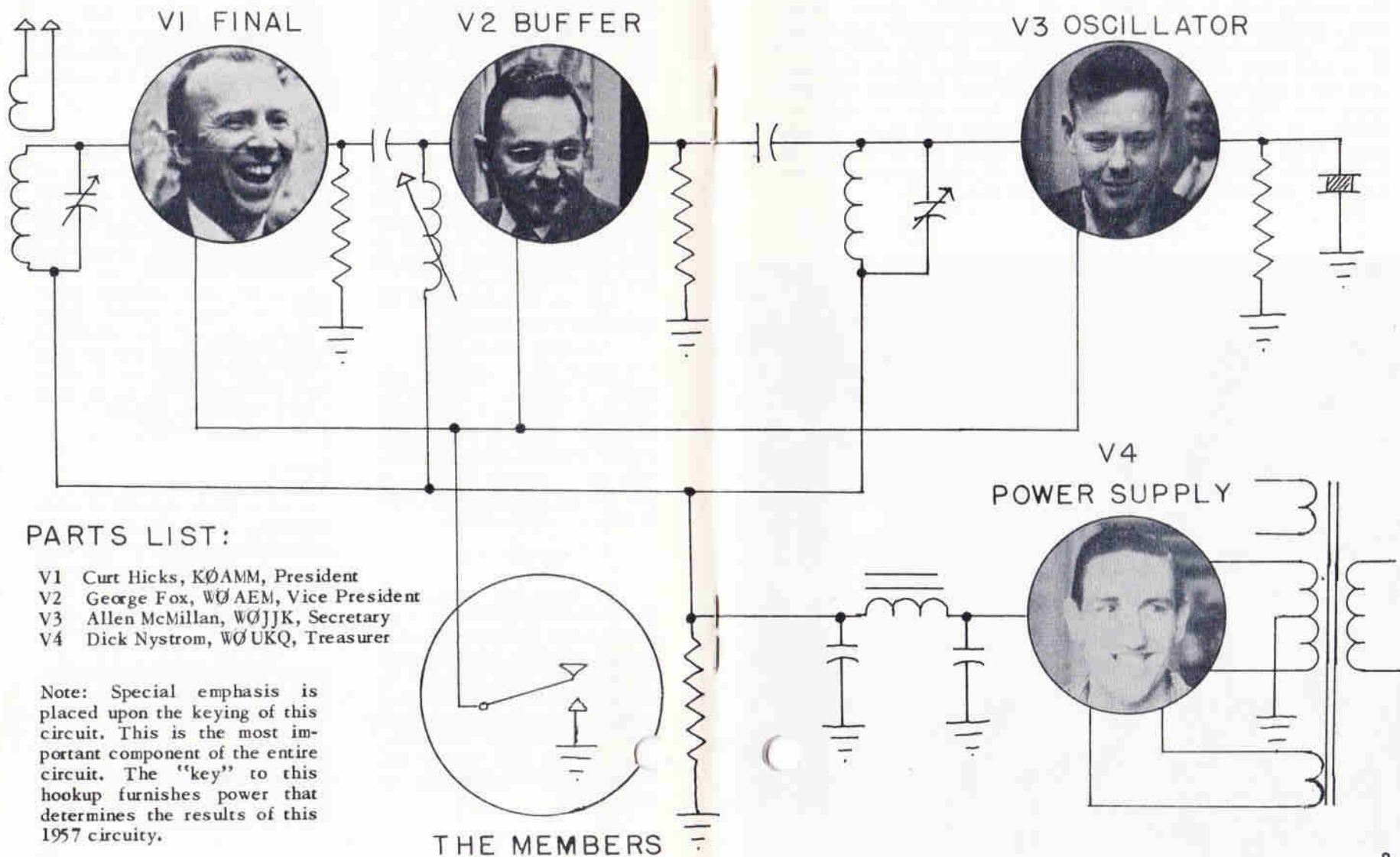

Note: Special emphasis is placed upon the keying of this circuit. This is the most important component of the entire circuit. The "key" to this hookup furnishes power that determines the results of this 1957 circuitry.
