Zenith Trans-Oceanic Radios

Mitch Saure (WB0GBI) provided an informative talk with a display numerous of vintage Trans Oceanic Radios that Zenith manufactured from the 1930s through





the late 1960s.. Zenith's founder, Commander Eugene McDonald, was a great admirer of advanced technological development and believed that his company's products should include the latest, most practical advances in a well-built product that continued to enhance the company's reputation. Although the "Trans-Oceanic" series were considered, at the time, portable radios, they were pretty hefty weighing in at over 30 pounds in some cases. This was mainly due to the "way things were built" back in those days before transistors were used. Although portable vacuum tubes were used, the radios were bulky and heavy due to the large batteries and transformers required by the high power consumption of the vacuum tubes.

Comments made during Mitch's presentation were that they seemed so large, if you traveled with one, you might have had to procure an extra seat on the train to accommodate your radio.

Most of the radios were equipped with an elaborate antenna stored inside the case that you would pull out and attach to the window of your train, boat, or vessel that you traveled on in those days. On some of the radios, the handles were adjustable antennas and could even be used for directional finders to beam on stations while out on your yacht; much like rabbit or fox hunting.
