Harbor Freight offers the three solar panels and a small charge controller on their web site for \$200. Forty five watts worth. Chris uses just three (45W) and a battery to run his all-band Kenwood radio. It's enough for the way he uses Amateur Radio.

Art UWR who also runs a solar station chimed in to list the advantages. Net Control, pointing out the advantages of fossil fuel derived electricity, seemed to get confused between Chris VEP's potential 180W panels and 180kW (kilowatts) that might power an automobile. Dave JSB said the 5.3 liter engine in his car was equivalent to (YQD helped calculate) 238 kilowatts. Net Control seemed to think you can poke a hole most anywhere in the Earth and fossil fuel oil will come spewing out. Even underwater.

In perusing a schematic of a computer power supply the other day I noticed one side of the AC line went directly to ground. Not the chassis. Power supply ground which is isolated from the metal part. It made me remember the "good old days" when they sometimes did that - right to the metal chassis and then to the case and shaft of the volume control—so if you took off the knob you could touch the chassis (with therefore a 50-50 chance of touching either 120 VAC Line In or the 0 Volt Neutral).

D'ya know about GFIs? Ground Fault Interrupters? They're required in all new construction, especially in the bathrooms where you could get between **Line In** and a good water pipe **ground**. My house was built in 1974 and didn't have any. I put in two, one in the shack and one in a bathroom. Good idea.

P.S. Some are RF sensitive. Don't buy a whole lot until you determine that aspect. John QKH said he can trip one in his house with 30 mW of RF.

P.P.S. Don't install your own GFI unless you can thoroughly explain the title of this article and how it relates to getting an electric shock.

New NE License Plate



Thanks to the hard work of Bob Mitchell, WBØRJJ, our Section State Government Liaison, Nebraska will be issuing new amateur radio "call plates" starting in 2011. The graphic and call letters will be forest green until 2017. Then they will switch to either blue or black.

Amateur Radio Plates are available through the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles to any person who holds a valid Amateur Radio Station License issued by the Federal Communications Commission.

The plates are inscribed with the applicant's official amateur radio call letters and are issued in lieu of regular plates. Amateur Radio Plates may be placed on motor vehicles, motorcycles, trailers, semitrailers and cabin trailers.

The fee for a set of Amateur Radio Plates is \$5.00 in addition to any other applicable registration fees and taxes and is paid to the County Treasurer at the time of initial registration and annually when the registration is renewed.

Amateur Radio License Plates do not afford the registered owner any special parking privileges.

Tech Test Gets a Little More Technical

Ever since the FCC dropped the code requirement and the Novice license exam, the Technician Class license has really been misnamed. Being the first license that most hams obtain, it really should have been called the Novice license. The question pool was arguably at the appropriate level for newcomers to amateur radio, being heavy on rules and operating practices, and perhaps a little light on technical topics.

That's about to change. On July 1, 2010, the question pool for the Tech test changes, and this version has noticeably more technical questions than the previous test. You could say that the Tech test is getting, errrr, a little more technical.

For example, the new question pool contains more questions about electronics components and their functions. In addition to that, examinees must also be able to identify the symbols for these components on a schematic diagram. This is a big change from the previous test, which had no diagrams at all. There are also more detailed questions about transistors and how they work.

There are also questions on how to make basic measurements with a multimeter how to troubleshoot basic problems that Technicians are likely to encounter. One question asks, "What two measurements are commonly made using a multimeter"? Answer: voltage and resistance. A follow up question asks, "What is the correct way to connect a voltmeter to a circuit"? Answer: in parallel with the circuit.

To make room for these questions, the committee dropped questions on operating practices and rules and regulations. In general, these are not big losses, but two questions that I was sorry to see go are the questions on the "basis and purpose" of amateur radio. I think these are very important for new amateurs to learn and keep in mind. (If you don't recall them, go to <u>http://www.arrl.org/part-97-amateur-radio</u> and review them.)

By the time you read this--or shortly thereafter--the new version of my No-Nonsense, Technician Class License Study Guide should be available. You can download it free of charge from my website, <u>www.kb6nu.com</u>. Look for the link in the right-hand column. It's currently in the hands of more than two dozen reviewers, who are proofreading it right now.

While it may not be in the initial release, I plan to include a section that contains links to websites that cover topics included in the study guide. That way, students can find more information on a topic, if they choose to do so. If you have any favorite websites that discuss making measurements with voltmeters or how to read schematic diagrams, I'd love to hear from you.

When not updating his No-Nonsense amateur radio license study guides, you'll find Dan on 40m, 30m, 20m, and if we ever get any sunspots to stick around, 15m and 10m pounding brass. You may even hear him trying to get the hang of using the bug he bought at Dayton this year.
