When used as part of a home security system, some X10 equipment can be programmed to dial a number if there's an emergency—a break-in, for example. However, Bill pointed out that it's not a good idea to have it dial 911: The operator needs to ask specific questions about the type of emergency and other details to get the right people to the right place in the shortest amount of time; information a machine can't provide.

The equipment is modular, reasonably priced, and devices can be added at any time. When browsing an X10 web page (link below), Bill stated that the temptation is to "...create a problem that is solved by the gadget you want to get." Parenthetically, he pointed out that one must beware of devices that are "chindogu," a Japanese term for "unuseless." A gadget is chindou if it performs a practical function that no one really wants. (A classic example is the device that lets you strap a roll of toilet paper to the top of your head so—if you're about to sneeze or need to blow your nose—you can reach up and pull down a few sheets.)

WA9ASD also described some of the technical details of X10 operation. This included frequencies used, possible sources of interference, interfacing, and communications protocol. The X10 protocol is an industry standard, which helps ensure interoperability between different manufacturer's modules.

Bill True, WA9ASD, gave a presentation on how to turn on a light at the June, 2010 meeting. One would think that this would make for a very short meeting considering that the audience consisted of people with above average electronics skills. However, Bill gave a talk that was both entertaining and educational. His subject matter ranged from basic slight-of-hand (lighting a bulb with a magnet and magnetic reed switch) to describing and demonstrating a complex home lighting system using X10 power line controllers and related equipment. The latter included controlling lights (directly and with timers), sensing when doors and windows were opened, and using video systems to remotely monitor areas, to name a few.

AARC Field Day 2010

Lack of space prevents describing even a fraction of the event. The following is some of my impressions (with some help of Jeff, WBØM).

The Ak-Sar-Ben Amateur Radio Club Field Day 2010 at Standing Bear Lake was a team effort. Everyone did several tasks in setting up the site, making contacts, logging contacts, cooking food, public relations, and—after the event ended—dismantling the site and cleaning up.

Setting up the site was going pretty well except for a slight snag when erecting one of the antennas. Pat, KØCTU had devised a slingshot combined with a fishing reel to send a sinker tied to 15-pound test line over a likely looking tall tree. The plan was to tie twine to the fishing line in preparation of hauling up the long-wire antenna. After a couple of attempts, he succeeded in getting the fishing line over the tree, but it unfortunately snapped after the twine was attached and people began hauling it up. Eventually the problem was solved by disconnecting the reel and shooting the twine directly into the tree. Lesson learned: Use something heavier than 15-pound test.

There was one minor casualty: Rob, KCØOYT twisted his knee while carrying some equipment up hill and was pretty much confined to the camper for the remainder of the day. This was not a bad thing as the outdoor temperature was in the up 90s and the camper was air conditioned.

A few days after the event, I sent emails to Claudia, KCØSQZ and to Jeff, WBØM asking for information on who besides them did the initial preparations. Claudia initiated the project, but had to stop due to illness in the family. Jeff took over and provided me with the following information (slightly edited).

Bill, KCØSVZ

Hi Bill, I had the easy job. All I did was send a whole lot of e-mails asking people to help and getting commitments on bodies and equipment. I'm sure there were a few eyes rolling as I asked simple questions (hi). I made sure we had information and QSTs to pass out to anyone—which we did—and took care of the PR side.
