Onawa, Iowa passed a local ordinance prohibiting any TVI from any source, with potential fines and jail terms. (though not specifically mentioned, it is obvious the included "Hams". The ARRL and the FCC wrote them they had no jurisdiction here, but they replied they would prosecute anyway!)

# Market-to-Market Relay

The 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Market-to-Market Relay will be held on October 9<sup>th</sup>. This is a fund-raising long distance running relay race from Omaha's Old Market to Lincoln's Haymarket. There are 21 relay points along the way. Amateur radio support is needed at each relay point. The relay points are between 3 and 5 miles apart. The 86-mile course is divided into legs of 2.45 to 5.5 miles. Each team selects a runner for three or four legs of the course.

Omaha area hams will cover the first 11 to 12 relay points. The Lincoln Amateur Radio club will take over from there and see the runners safely into the Haymarket area in downtown Lincoln. There is no Husker Football game that day. (The game is on Thursday that week).

The earliest volunteers will be needed about 5:30 a.m. (I KNOW!!!! But I will be up too!) and we should have all the runners passed our coverage area by 2:00. The early volunteers generally cover 2 or more of the exchange points over the course of the race.
