KAØVNY, and Adam KDØMMG all volunteered to help him out. Bill KCØSVZ showed up later with notepad and camera to document the event. The site was on top of a three story building, but the roof was nearly flat, so there was little chance of falling off.

Construction went well, but there was initially a problem of getting the SWR to below 2:1 on some bands. This resulted in lowering the antenna, adjusting the elements, raising it again, testing it with an MFJ-259 SWR Analyzer, and repeating as necessary.

Finally a compromise was reached, the antenna mounts were tightened, the tools were carefully

lowered to the ground with a rope, and we went inside for final checks. WØSMY was able to cancel the remaining SWR on all bands with his MFJ IntelliTuner.

The speaker for the September meeting was the ARRL Section Manager for Nebraska, Matt Anderson, KAØBOJ, who talked about amateur radio and the ARRL.

Matt began by describing some of his personal history: How he'd gotten into amateur radio when he was a Boy Scout; building a crystal radio as a kid; and later building a Heathkit HW-16 CW Transceiver with Joe KØNEB as his Elmer. He joined the ARRL and, as time passed, he got more involved in their activities—eventually serving as Emergency Coordinator and twice as the Section Manager. He was elected to

SM again in early 2013 after Art Zygielbaum, KØAIZ, decided to step down.

Matt encouraged interaction with the audience by asking Club members at random how they got into ham radio—some had Elmers, others through Scouting, still others got into it on their own. After listening to the members talk, he pointed out that a common thread was the magic of communicating by radio.

Matt stated that this "magic" can be used to get others interested in the hobby, and gave a personal example: Once, when picking up some food at a fast food drive-thru, the young woman at the window saw him talking to someone in Australia and asked him what he was doing. He responded by showing her how it was done and making two contacts in the process. He told her how anybody can get into ham radio and gave her some ARRL brochures for more information.

He concluded by pointing out that amateur radio is a hobby. It is true that it's an asset to the community, nation, and world; it nevertheless is a hobby, so have fun.
