point of noting this, he said "This is an ongoing investigation. I can't comment any further.

ChicKEN had been reported missing from the AARC Field Day location at approximately 0200 CDT on June 25th 2000. The unidentified kidnapers left a ransom note demanding "\$100 Billion in small unmarked coins." Several club members were organized to apprehend the kidnapers, but have been unsuccessful." In July a small percentage of ChicKEN was anonymously returned in the form of chicken nuggets. Sources stated "the mass of the recovered nuggets was not large enough to account for the entire remains of the weather chicken." Including today's discovery only about 30% of ChicKEN's remains have been recovered.

Further details will be reported as they develop.

### **ChicKEN Remains Found**

The remains of ChicKEN (N0EGG) the AK-SAR-BEN Amateur Radio
Club's faithful Field Day weather researcher were found near an OPPD
repeater site not far from Nashville. The partial remains of ChicKEN were
discovered wedged behind an electrical box by club members touring the
site. Un-named sources are quoted as saying "Hey, look at that!" and
"Eewww, I think it's dead, oh no... It's ChicKEN!"



Club members remembered ChicKEN saying "There has never been a better weather chicken, we'll miss him."

Forensic <u>experts</u> called in to examine the crime scene positively identified the remains of ChicKEN saying "it seems to have been tossed over this fence." Across from the fence, only a short distance away, stands an office building where club member and tour guide Eddie Edwards (KOIL) has a private office. Officials speculated that someone may have attempted to dispose of "the evidence" by tossing it over the fence.

Witnesses from the tour group stated that Mr Edwards was seen "scarfing down some kind of food" when they arrived. However, they could not agree on the exact nature of what he was eating. "Edwards cannot be ruled out as a suspect, but we don't know why he would invite fellow amateurs to the crime scene without cleaning it up better" said an official. A witness who asked to remain anonymous stated "Eddie did such a good job organizing Field Day, I don't know how it could be him. He's just not that kind of guy." Mr. Edwards was questioned and released pending further investigation.

An official also noted that ChicKEN (N0EGG) is not related in any way to any amateur radio operator in Minnesota. When asked why he made a

## DTV Program 03/14

Report and Photo by Rich Swig WA0ZQG



Warren Behrens, Chief Engineer at Ch. 7, holds an Extra Class license, K0WMB. He showed up at our Friday night March meeting with his laptop computer, LCD projector, and DTV receiver card for the PCM slot. All the local channels have digital signals now on the UHF band, and Warren's Ch. 7 is on Ch. 20. After midnight on February 17<sup>th</sup> next year you won't be able to find a signal on Ch. 7, and if you don't have a Digital TV or converter, you won't find anything on Ch. 20 either. (The old analog sets want a carrier and AM sidebands and the digital stuff just doesn't compute. No carrier.)

The official reason for the switch to Digital is freeing up some UHF channels for other services, radios and phones, but as you've noticed the manufacturers are going to make some bucks selling thousand dollar TV sets also. (You can buy a 13 in. CRT type Digital at Wal-Mart for \$94, but the tube means you're limited to 480i resolution. 'Real' Digital sets offer 720p or 1080i resolution.)

The Digital revolution will use channels 2-51 with the remainder through 83 sold off to those other services. (Also, Ch. 37 will remain off limits, used for Radio Astronomy.. Channel 55 has already been sold to Qualcomm - nationwide.)

Besides resolution on the main video stream, one other advantage to Digital is the ability to send out more than one program on the same channel. Ch. 7 currently uses 16M of the 19.4MB/sec data capability on Ch. 20 for a Digital version of their main program, and another 2MB for a continuous weather report. The educational channels around here send out three (3) video streams, each one a totally separate program. Limited to the same 19.4MB overall data rate, they must necessarily reduce resolution to something like 6MB, 6MB, and 5MB (for the 3<sup>rd</sup> program). At my house in So. Council Bluffs there are currently twelve (12) old style channels and nineteen (19) digital video streams available for free over the air. (Hey, if you taped even half of that and watched it you'd never get any sleep. Maybe we could uh, **drop the cable** connection and still have a pretty good selection of programs for FREE.)

### Field Day 2008

We need people to help organize this thing -- I simply can't do it myself. We need someone to head up food. There are grill-ish things out here. I vote for doing a potluck or something, and perhaps grilling dogs and burgers out there. FYI, There's a HyVee on 370, east of the park. We need people to be in charge of shacks. That begs the question, what bands? What modes? UP TO YOU! I'm still green, HF is still a bit of a mystery to me, so I need LOTS OF HELP here.
